Annual subscription covers member's insurance, registrations with the League & County FA. team equipment and kit. It covers the provision of all home pitches to be used for fixtures, friendlies and training. This fee also goes toward subsidising coach training courses with The FA, CRB checks and other running costs for the Club

[2]

Match fees cover the cost of referee fees and any ancillary items [e.g. first aid items, replacement kit items etc]. The Club charges for both home and away fixtures to spread the cost across the season





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Club Philosophy & Ethos - Conduct & Behaviour

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The Club's philosophy is to provide football to as many young people as possible, whatever their skill level and to engender good sportsmanship, behaviour and the concept of fair play. Winning in any sport is an exhilarating achievement, but we also expect our members to accept defeat gracefully and congratulate their opponents when not winning.

Our primary aim is to make training and games enjoyable for our members in a friendly atmosphere.

Any member showing consistent bad behaviour may have their membership rescinded for the good of the Club as a whole.

The Club is run for the benefit of the young people, but we do of course welcome their families at matches asking only that vocal support be constructive and encouraging rather than critical and hurtful.

It should always be remembered that applause is an excellent motivator.

Code of Conduct for parents & spectators

Parents and spectators have a great influence on children's enjoyment and success in football. All children play football because they first and foremost love the game - its fun.

It is important to remember that however good a child becomes at football, positive encouragement will improve and contribute to:

- 1) children enjoying football
- 2) obtaining a sense of personal achievement
- 3) self-esteem
- 4) Improving the child's skills and techniques.

Parents & Supporters attitudes have a significant bearing on a child's attitude towards, other players, referees and officials, managers and spectators, so please ensure your comments are always positive, not only to your own children but also to all children playing.

Please remember:

- 1) Applaud the opposition as well as our own team.
- 2) Don't coach your child during the match
- 3) On no account shout or scream.
- 4) Always respect the referee's decision.
- 5) Give praise to all the children involved, not just the most talented.
- 6) Refrain from all racist and sexist comments.
- 7) Never encroach on the field of play unless invited to do so by a match official.

In line with the Football Association and the MK & Border Counties Youth League, our Club will not tolerate bad behaviour from either Club Members or their Parents and supporters.





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Club Membership: Rules & Guidance

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1) It is the responsibility of parents and guardians to ensure that their child is brought to and collected from all football activities promptly. A parent or guardian should accompany young children during football activities unless this is previously agreed with the team Manager. If for some reason your child is unable to attend training or a match you should contact the team Manager or Coach to let them know the position.

2) Whilst training will be provided, participation in every game may not always be possible. Consideration will be given to the commitment and physical development of a child in order to help and assist him or her achieve an optimum ability.

3) The Club must be informed of any medical condition that may impact on your child participating in any football activity **and you must ensure that he or she does not take part in any activity if he or she is unwell or has sustained an injury.**

4) All members are required to pay training, match fees and entrance to festivals/events throughout the season. The Club reserves the right to review and if required increase the annual subscription, training and match fees during the season.

5) Whilst every care is taken to maintain the highest standards of safety during football activities. The Club its Members, Officers, Managers & Coaches are under no liability whatsoever for any loss or damage to property, accidents or injuries to any child or adult however caused.

6) The Club has a Child Protection Policy and any concerns regarding child abuse or any related welfare issue must be directed to the Club's Welfare Officer, Harry Catharell, 07759 039148

7) The Club holds Public Liability Insurance through the Berks & Bucks FA Ltd and has limited insurance for accident and injury through the Clubs own brokers. However it is strongly recommended that additional personal accident and medical cover is obtained for your child through your own insurance company.

8) All members' parents, guardians, participating family & friends must uphold good standards of conduct and behaviour at all times during training, matches and any other gathering or football activity involving the Club. The Club reserves the right to cancel the membership of any child who breaches the above rule. In addition any adult will also be asked to cease attending any football activity if their conduct and behaviour is deemed unacceptable by the Club.

All Clubs and Leagues adhere to the F.A. RESPECT campaign and Great Linford FC is accountable to the F.A. for the behaviour of its members, parents, coaches & officers

9) It is the Parent or Guardian's responsibility to ensure that their children wear appropriate clothing, protective shin pads and suitable safe footwear.
